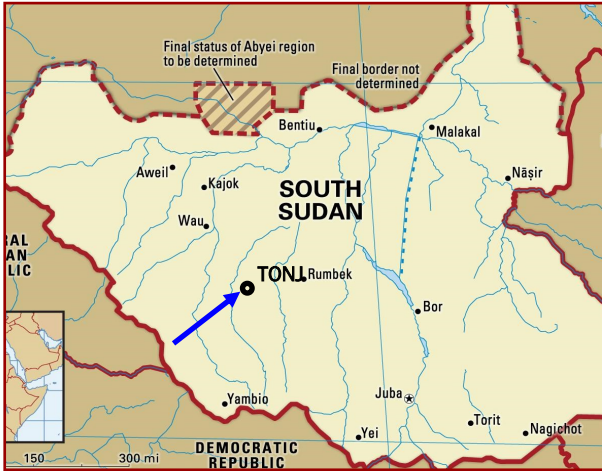

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic Medical Teams Worldwide's direct medical outreaches have become limited. However there is an "on the ground" sister medical relief organization, In Deed and Truth Ministry, with whom we have co-labored on the same projects for years. In order to continue our direct medical relief efforts, we will directly support their physician directed medical relief during the Covid 19 pandemic. has worked many times) that serves maternal and child health. Their 26 bed facility for pediatric patients is often so overwhelmed with patients that the overflow patients are treated on the outside porch for the duration of their treatment. They are the only facility for premature babies for hundreds of miles. Consequently they are a referral center for the local hospitals.

Newborn baby Agau was admitted to the pediatric ward in critical condition with neonatal tetanus. His body was almost like a board, and he was having muscle spasms every few minutes. He struggled to breathe from the chest muscle spasms. After 4 weeks of treatment he was ready to go home with his very happy parents.

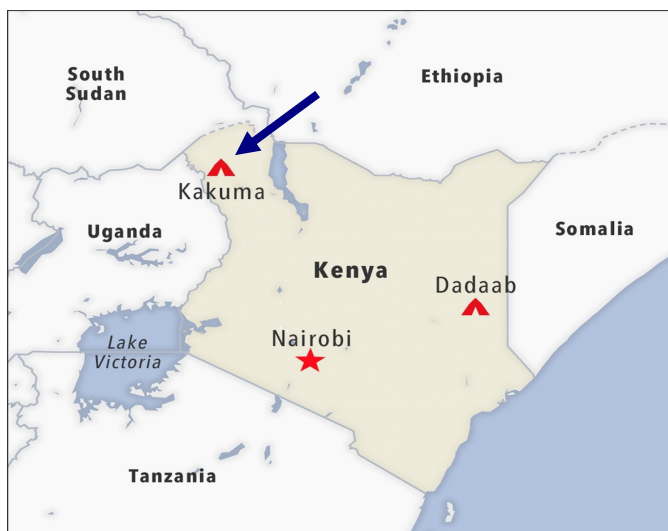

IN 2021 AT KAKUMA REFUGEE CAMP MEDICAL TEAMS WORLDWIDE PURCHASED AND DISTRIBUTED NEARLY 5 TONS OF FOOD TO HUNDREDS OF FAMILIES AND 200 ORPHAN CHILDREN.



Medical Teams Worldwide has continued to work with the 280,000 Sudanese refugees in Kakuma camp in Kenya–South Sudan border. *The United Nations food rations have been decreasing significantly so the food donated by Medical Teams Worldwide donors helped hundreds of families. A number of families said the food donated came at the best time to “bridge the gap” in getting food to eat. Due to the generosity of our donors Medical Teams Worldwide in 2021 was able to purchase and distribute another 5 tons of food this year of beans and corn. Soap bars were also distributed (to help with the the Covid crisis along with deworming medicine for hundred's of children.*

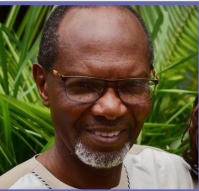

MEDICAL SUPPLIES FOR TONJ HOSPITAL AND IDAT MOTHERS AND CHILDREN CLINIC IN SOUTH SUDAN



Presently, a dedicated x-ray suite is being built for the x-ray diagnostic equipment donated last year to Tonj medical facilities. This year Medical Teams Worldwide is donating two AED devices to the health care community in Tonj. These 2 devices retail for a total of about \$20,000 Dollars.

Due to the recent South Sudan Civil war refugees poured into Kakuma refugee camp. As a result, the Kalobeyei Settlement was created to unload Kakuma Camp which was at 300% of its capacity. Kalobeyei settlement houses now 38,000 refugees. Medical Teams Worldwide is assessing the medical needs of the refugee camp. We will coordinate with the UN administration to find the areas of most need. Above is an example of a local medical clinic we have designed for rural areas of Africa.
